| Theme | Activities |

| Fieldwork and Observation | Participation in direct service delivery system- case management, counselling services, group activity, and community organization. |
| Assessment and Evaluation | Learning to assess client needs, develop intervention plans, report writing and evaluate the effectiveness of services. |
| Practical Skills Development | Focusing on development of practical skills such as professional communication, interpersonal relationship and rapport-building, problem solving, adoptability, resilience and conflict resolution. Enhancement of analytical observation. |
| Community Engagement: | Need identification, addressing social inequalities, building partnership with CBOs, participation in community outreach and advocacy activities and promoting social change. |
